

Are you a smoker? Have you ever been a smoker?

If you answered “yes” to either of these questions, you may be eligible to participate in the free Lung Cancer Screening Project at Mills-Peninsula.

This three-year research project, funded by the Mills-Peninsula Hospital Foundation, is looking at whether state-of-the-art CT scanning technology can identify lung cancer at an earlier stage. *Mills-Peninsula is one of only a few health care organizations in California participating in this international study. The research is coordinated by the International Early Lung Cancer Action Program (I-ELCAP).*

To be eligible, you must:

- Be in generally good health
- Be age 55 or older
- Have smoked a pack a day for 30 years or the equivalent (i.e. two packs a day for 15 years, or three packs a day for 10 years)
- No history of breast cancer or melanoma, other cancers acceptable if cancer-free for five years (skin cancer is excepted)
- Have a Mills-Peninsula or other community-based primary care physician

Participants receive painless CT scans a minimum of four times over three years. There is no charge to participants.
